HISTORY OF CHESANING

Saginaw News Report Nov. 19, 1965 Chesaning Hotel Destroyed

CHESANING: Twenty persons escaped from the Hotel Central, 102 W. Broad, early this morning when flames engulfed the two-story 81year-old structure. The loss has been put at \$75,000.

One volunteer fireman, Robert Muirhead, 24, suffered bruises when he slipped from a roof and fell 20 feet while fighting the fire.

About 50 volunteer firemen from four communities—Chesaning, Owosso, St. Charles, and Saginaw Township—fought the four-alarm blaze.

Chesaning Fire Chief Fordney Volkmer said the first alarm was sounded at 4:45a.m. The next three alarms, calling the departments from the other communities, followed quickly. The old pine timber frame building burned fiercely, Volkmer said flames at one time shot a hundred feet into the air. The red glow from the fire glistened eerily on the Christmas decorations strung along Chesaning's main street.

The hotel, owned by Henry A. Moldenhauer, was reported a total loss. Stock in Jane's Village Shop, on the lower floor of the hotel, was also lost.

Volkmer said smoke damage probably was heavy in the Arthur Ramsdill barber shop, separated from the hotel proper by a heavy wall which kept the flames from it. Other buildings near the hotel also were expected to have some smoke damage.

The blaze was difficult to fight. The hotel had a brick facing over a wood frame. The firemen brought the blaze under control but flames still were visible as late as 8:30a.m. Hotel Fire cont:

The out of town units were able to leave the scene at 9:15a.m. Chesaning firemen stood by to guard against further outbreaks.

Moldenhauer said he had gone to bed, about 3:50a.m., when somebody ran down the hall shouting, "FIRE" !!

He said he rushed to the rear of the hotel and could see smoke and flames erupting from a rear apartment occupied by two construction workers from Grand Rapids. One of them Curtis Kaolin; ran onto the street, stopped a car and asked the occupants to get help.

Another hotel guest, Sidney Klenkosky of Bay City said, he was sleeping when all the running and yelling woke me up. There was no trouble getting out, most of the people saved their clothes and suitcases.

Moouldenhaueer, who purchased the hotel in 1953, said the loss was partly covered by insurance. Those who escaped included Moldenhauer's wife, grandson and a friend of the grandson.

"This is the first time we had a fire here", he said. "Look's like it'll be the last and the only one for Hotel Central. Dressed in pajamas and covered in a coat - he sat dejectedly in an automobile as the hotel burned.
